Institution Profile	Tsuru University is a public university in the city of Tsuru, a town of 30,000 people at the southeastern foot of Mt. Fuji in Yamanashi Prefecture, Japan. Founded in 1955 as a two-year teacher's training college, Tsuru University became a four-year university of Humanities in 1960. We share a belief and sense of mission that the aim of university education is to nourish young people to become mature, responsible citizen with a deep understanding of humanity.

Students can enjoy a day trip to some of the famous tourist attractions such as Shinjuku, Shibuya, Harajuku, Asakusa and Akihabara.

TISP (Tsuru International Student Program)	One-semester undergraduate program with strong focus on language, culture, society and local community immersion featuring 3.5-week intensive Japanese Language courses (4 credits worth)
Program Eligibility	Students of all levels of Japanese language skills at a higher institution, with a GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale or equivalent.

Average Living Cost in Tsuru	Approximately ¥70,000 (about US\$630) a month including <i>Kaikan</i> rent, food, mandatory NHS health insurance, travel, and other miscellaneous.
